for a unique response to their clients' needs and wishes. Most of these gardens have never been open to the public.

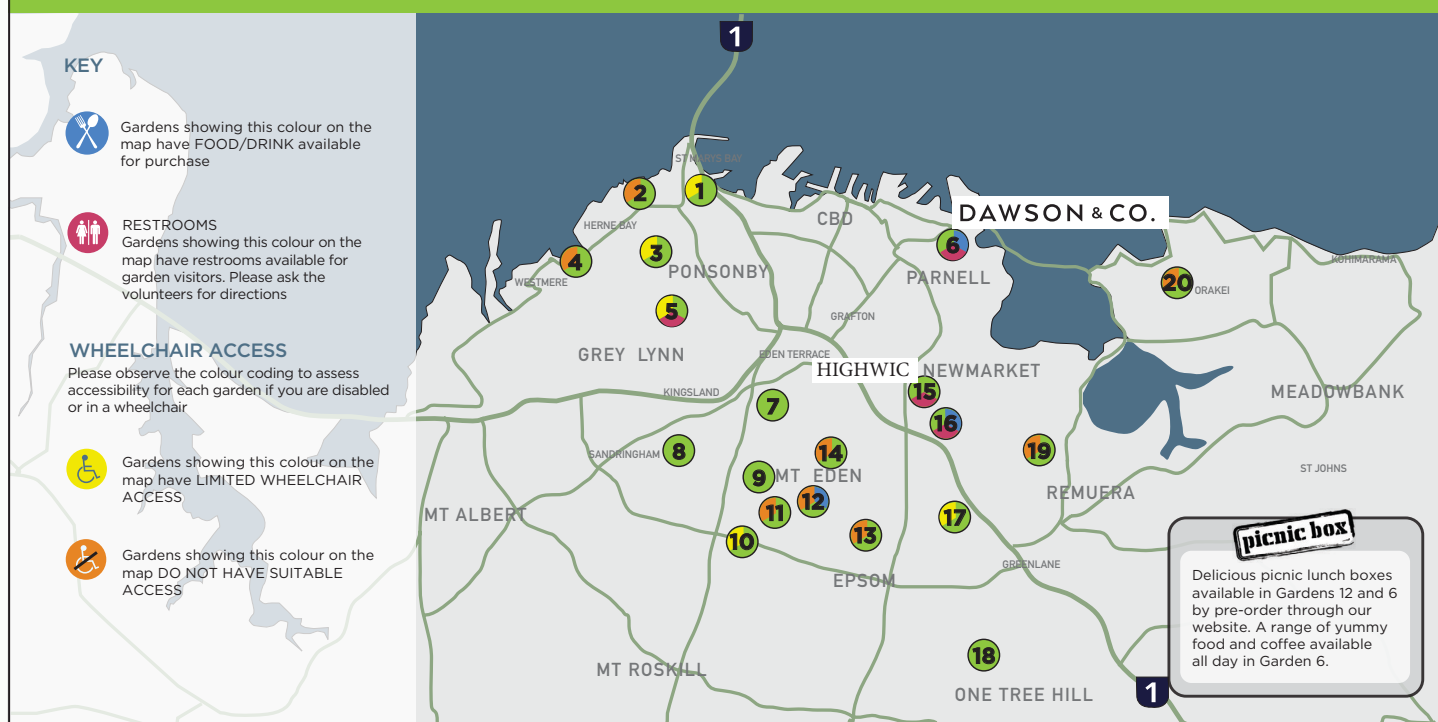

6 Melford St, St Mary's Bay

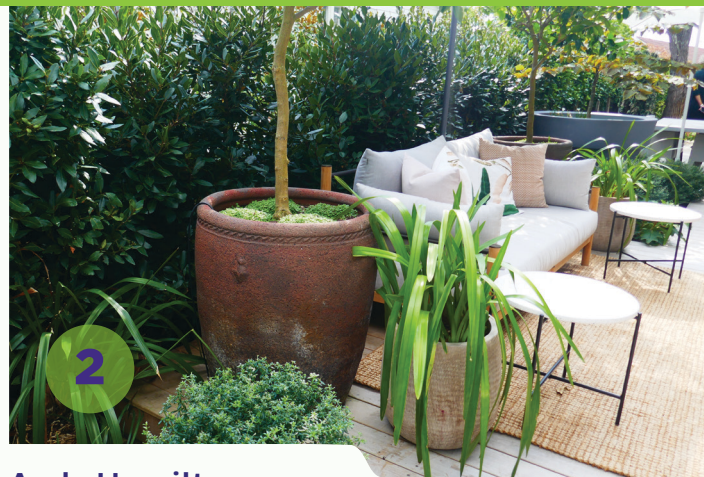
A South Pacific setting inspired by a holiday in Italy. Previously this was a perfectly good courtyard garden but the owners knew there was more potential. Trudy wanted the space to be dynamic and versatile with references to Polynesia.

"We often sit with our backs to our houses, looking out. I like to find places that are comfortable to be in, where we can look back at the house and where we become part of the garden."

This garden shows what can be achieved in a small space and still pack a punch!

The brief for this garden was to introduce a contemporary and usable space around the architectural addition at the rear of the house that connects with a re-imagined front garden. The challenge was to make a stylistically cohesive space that feels modern but with a nod to the historic character of the villa dwelling. The garden is in three main parts. The space to the west of the house provides a pool garden with a small terrace of decking set within planting. The garden running down the north side of the house provides an external living space adjoining the kitchen and living room. The front garden sought to maximise the size of a central rectangle of lawn for the kids to play on.

Damian Wendelborn

30 Tawariki St, Ponsonby

The owners of this relocated bungalow wanted to create an eye-catching scene in the front that drew visitors into the house. At the rear, something more relaxed was required to surround an existing sun deck.

The design response in the front garden contrasts structural elements of a contemporary flavour with plantings of clipped dark green foliage and stately palms, imparting a classic feel. At the rear, large pots and timber elements provide drama via scale and form. Planting here is a riotous mix, resulting in a more relaxed vibe.

Hard materials unite front and rear spaces via a common language.

The design brief for this garden in Westmere was to unify architecture and landscape, as part of an extensive renovation. The front entrance was a clay pathway adjacent to the garage, which led up a slippery path to the front door. The challenge here was to establish a hierarchy between the different access ways and provide a sense of arrival. The pool side gardens use foliage, texture and pockets of colour to create a visual connection with the inside.

24 Dickens St, Grey Lynn

After working with these clients on previous gardens, I had a good understanding of the look and feel we wanted this garden to have: creating their own piece of Eden in Grey Lynn, influenced by photos and ideas they had from holidays in Europe. Restricted access impacted design decisions around levels and existing features. Creating a beautiful space for entertaining and relaxing was key for the design, using colour, formal hedges and traditional plants such as roses and hydrangeas. The large white Pergola is a stand-out piece in the garden creating broken shade on hot summer days.

Val's clients contacted her from London, where they were living at the time. Their brief was very specific: functional, privacy and lush planting. Aspects of the property needed addressing immediately. Unusable battered lawn, neighbouring complex to be screened. The main hallway in the house was the Design Guide, it sat central to the front garden and the rear gardens. Lines, views and plant positions were taken from the hallway to ensure the garden was seen at its best advantage. Val says, "I knew what they wanted, they had complete faith in me from the outset and they love their garden."

We created three deep planting beds, kept an existing avocado tree and mass-planted four layers of subtropical plants with a mixture of leaf shape, size and colour to create a jungle feel. Corten steel screens create an 'envelope' around the outdoor dining space. Large specimen palms, wires and climbing plants completed this 'Lush Tropical Haven' which my clients love! A refresh of plants created a modern yet formal, pretty and productive front garden.

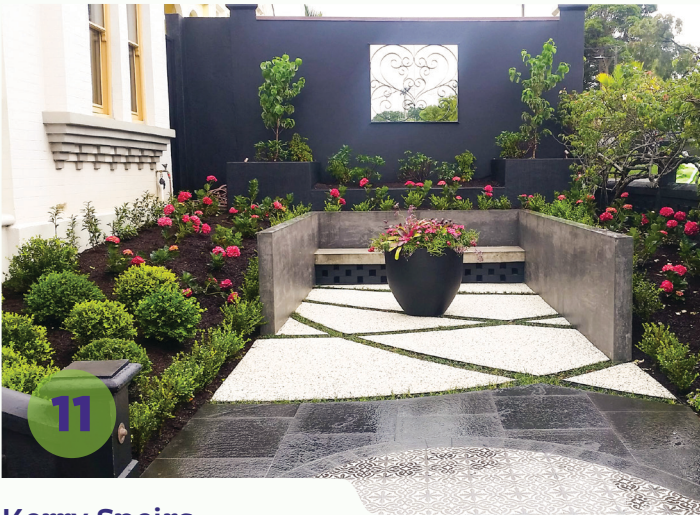


Xanthe White Design

44 Valley Rd, Mt Eden

This project in Maungawhau involved Xanthe White Design Studio interacting with an existing garden which already had layers of history and a significant treescape. Rather than a top down design which imposed a new concept over the top, the fresh ideas were woven through the fabric of the existing garden, blurring the lines between old and new. A collaborative project between designers and owners, the concept acknowledges that a garden is never finished but more a continued dance between its makers and the elements. The Maungawhau Garden is a wonderful example of an established garden being given a new lease of life through interventions that are a marriage of the old and new, creating a timeless and dynamic space that will continue to evolve.

A front garden brief to 'do justice to the house' saw us design to reveal and enhance previously hidden, heritage detailing. Intended to be one of a kind, this gorgeous garden is unlike any other we have designed. It has visual richness, whimsical elements and despite its small size, features an interesting mix of unusual materials and bespoke detailing. Our careful planning and significant construction work to preserve original structures are now hard to comprehend beneath the finished landscaping, which successfully blends old and new in a seamless manner, including the planting which uses traditional plants in a colourful, contemporary way.

A winding sheltered driveway is met with a modern front entry garden of contrasting plants, textures and colours. Venturing further through the garden, little pockets of planting guide you through, including a restful westerly courtyard and simple water feature. However, the real transformation occurs as you step onto the cliff of a steep lush urban gully which opens up before you. Built on the volcanic skirts of Maungawhau, I wanted to create a cascade of subtropical planting layered throughout the oasis. Being keen gardeners with a love of art and a real appreciation of design, the clients have asked me to incorporate powerful sculptures amongst the garden beds creating a rich composition.

Highwic is a 19th century house in Auckland, New Zealand, which is listed by Heritage New Zealand as a Category I structure. The house was built in 1862 for Alfred Buckland, a wealthy colonial settler and landowner. The building sits in an elevated position above Newmarket.

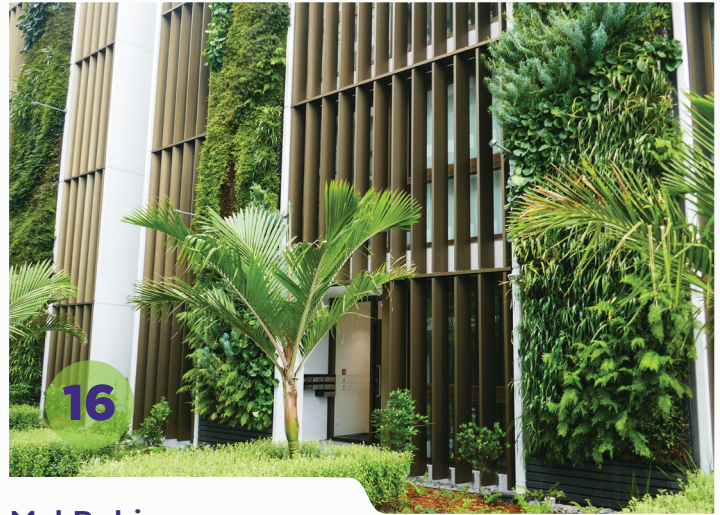

Xanthe White Design

19 Essex Avenue, Mt Eden

The design of this garden has a duality to it. The exterior speaks to the streetscape and the architecture both new and old. An eclectic blend of flowers and natives acknowledge both the historical landscape and the colonial imprint. Patterns in the pavings draw angles from the architecture to gently slip through the planting. The rear of the garden unravels from the courtyard to gently contour and flow over the natural levels of the lava extending to views of the maunga. It is a gardener's garden rich in native plantings, productive trees and seasonal colour, as well as a vegetable garden made from stone that came out of the site during the build. This garden is a gentle touch working to blur boundaries to create private but expanding views to the beyond.

10 St Marks Rd, Remuera

Awarded Best in Category for Multi-Unit Development at this year's Property Council Awards, the Client John Harman's brief to showcase a new modality of urban living ensured that the St Marks Luxury Apartment Complex has become a landmark development. Charged with challenging the 'empty concrete jungle' status quo that many high-density apartment complexes deliver, landscape architect Mel Robinson was entrusted with creating a green sanctuary that brought the wider landscape in, "greenwashing" not only the concrete slab on top of the basement carparking, but also the walls. Three large panels make up NZ's tallest outdoor greenwalls which received the country's first ever Homestar Innovation Point with predominantly native planting accented with pops of seasonal colour.

The bus tour will visit half the gardens on Saturday and the other half on Sunday. The tour meeting point will be at 9am for a 9.15am departure each day at Highwic, 40 Gillies Avenue, Newmarket. There is some parking on site, but please assist by being dropped off or using public transport on Saturday as there is also a wedding being held at Highwic. It is a short taxi ride from the city and from public train and bus routes. There is a possibility of more parking being available at the new '277' complex by November.

The coach will return to Highwic around 4.30pm (please be aware that traffic conditions on the day make this an estimate only, so we advise not to make any arrangements, such as flight bookings, too tight!). At the last garden of each tour, we will round off the day with an opportunity for an informal walk around a garden, glass of wine in hand.

Cost: \$170 for one day, and \$320 for those registering for both days. This price includes a delicious Picnic Box lunch, refreshments, coach travel, tour guides, entry fees and garden notes.

I had worked with the clients on their previous garden and started work on this garden in 2013. It was a densely planted overgrown garden with a small terrace, and paths leading to a back lawn. The clients wanted to improve the aesthetics of their entrance. They wanted a large covered outdoor garden space to extend their internal entertaining area. They wanted a feeling of space in their front garden and to actually see their lawn and have a better relationship between the various garden levels. The garden looked small but it actually wasn't – they just couldn't see it.

This mature family garden has been developed and refined over 30 years by its experienced and skilled landscape designer owner, creating a relaxing and engaging atmosphere. The outdoor living area and fishpond at the rear are surrounded with lush subtropical planting, with deciduous trees and climbers that create diverse seasonal interest throughout the year. Nearby, adorned with fruit trees, topiary and perennials, a new lawn and vegetable garden have replaced a recently removed swimming pool.

When the clients decided to rejuvenate their garden, they approached Kate Ryan from Zones with a brief to create something stunning with a tropical resort feel. Set against the striking black and white exterior of this beautiful home, the planting needed to be bold yet considered. Bursts of colour throughout the planting and consideration to brighten areas created the desired effect. The house is located down a long, shared driveway so importance was placed on creating character at the main entranceway. A specially designed corten steel gate and fence with back lit number plate give this unique look.

32 Tautari St, Orakei

This totally reinvented garden is only two years old. A wood formed concrete planter intersects the original deck and extends into the new hoggin area. Olive 'El Greco' hedging, limestone paths and perennial flower beds have replaced an unused lawn. Native grasses Chionochloa flavicans and Carex testacea mingle with perennials Salvia 'Love and Wishes' and Sedum 'Autumn Joy' to create a habitat for insects and birds. The fire bowl acts as a gathering point and extends the use of the garden into the night. The dividing wall adds interest in exploring what lies behind. The new front garden creates a connection to the streetscape and offers a subtle welcome.
